MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FRANKLIN HELD AT THE FRANKLIN MUNICIPAL BUILDING 46 MAIN STREET, FRANKLIN, NJ JUNE 11, 2024

Mayor Sowden led the assembly in the flag salute. Mayor Sowden requested a moment of silence for Robert Dabinett, former councilman, who recently passed away.

It has been properly advertised by posting in Borough Hall and printed in the New Jersey Herald/Sunday New Jersey Herald on January 7, 2024, and posted on the Borough website, which adequate notice has been certified by the Clerk."

PRESENTATIONS

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mrs. Heath commented that the recreation bus trip to the casino is almost sold out, the Yankee game bus trip scheduled for September 28, 2024 is half sold out, Miss Franklin pageant is June 28, 2024 at the Senior Center at 7pm, there will be a pond side market before Franklinite at 12pm on June 29, 2024, National Night out is August 6, 2024 and fishing derby is October 12, 2024 at 8am.

Mr. Skellenger had nothing to report.

Mr. Formica commented that the Franklin Borough received a \$77,000 local recreation improvement grant and the Fire Department received a rescue plan fire fighter grant in the amount of \$60,000.

Mr. Limon commented that the road and buildings and grounds subcommittee will be having a meeting soon. We received a road mower quote and street sweeper quote.

Mr. Snyder had nothing to report.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION

Mr. Formica made a motion to open the meeting to the public for anyone wishing to address the Governing Body. Seconded by Mr. Skellenger. All were in favor.

Mrs. Joanne Tatka stepped forward. Mrs. Tatka asked if there was any comment on the police accident from two weeks ago. Mrs. Tatka commented about the purchasing of 2 new Tahoe's for the Police department, the police department promotion and asked if the new police officer is a Franklin resident.

Mr. Leonard Helmstetter stepped forward. Mr. Helmstetter asked about the property maintenance ordinance and how it is being enforced.

Ms. Rene Zierold stepped forward. Ms. Zierold commented on the proposed development of 500 units on Main Street, how would the development effect the environment and what kind of an impact would it have on the asphalt, what impact would this development have on the landfill, how would this development affect the

capacity of the wells and how would this development affect the sewer system. Ms. Zierold commented that she has walked the trails around this property.

Ms. Lori Fowley stepped forward. Ms. Fowley commented that her concern is not just the environment. Ms. Fowley's concern is the size of the development. The schools could potentially be overcrowded. Will we need more police, fire and EMT's as well additional equipment. Please take these concerns into consideration when making decisions.

Mr. Michael Walters stepped forward. Mr. Walters commented that his concerns are about the increase in schools. Mr. Walters commented that our wells cannot handle a 500-unit apartment complex and the sewer wouldn't be able to handle the size. There are sink holes in the property that may make development hard. Please consider these issues.

Ms. Brittany McFatridge stepped forward. Ms. McFatridge commented that the property by her house is nice and doesn't want to see it go.

Mr. Tom Prol stepped forward. Mr. Prol commented that he is the attorney for the developer. Mr. Prol stated that there is no pending development application nor is there 500 units, there is only the adoption of a redevelopment plan. There are environmental issues on the property and clean up would have to be done on the property and that is regulated by DEP. Mr. Prol commented that there are broken buildings and contamination of the property. Mr. Prol addressed questions brought up from those in attendance. Mr. Prol commented that there is a lot of capacity for sewer and traffic will be considered. The stormwater pertaining to Zinc Mine property will also be considered.

Nicole stepped forward. Nicole commented that she is concerned about the walking children to and from school.

Ms. Eve Soares stepped forward. Ms. Soares commented that she was not putting out misinformation, she was just trying to get the word out about this possible project.

Ms. Lori Fowley stepped forward. Ms. Fowley commented on the redevelopment plan, is the rendering on the plan the possible development.

Mr. Leonard Helmstetter stepped forward. Mr. Helmstetter asked who pays for cleanup.

Mr. Ursin commented that the town does not own the property and any clean up would be between the property owner or the developer. Mr. Ursin explained the tax issues.

Ms. Elaina Hall stepped forward. Ms. Hall commented that this is a cute town and this development would ruin the beautiful town.

Mr. Don DeVore stepped forward. Mr. DeVore commented that there seems to be some miscommunication, and nothing is a secret here.

Mayor Sowden explained how residents can get information on the town.

Mr. Tom Fowley stepped forward. Mr. Fowley asked if information can be placed on the bulletin board that is by the pond.

Mrs. Joanne Tatka stepped forward. Mrs. Tatka questioned the redevelopment plan and if there will be public meetings and hearings in the future. Mrs. Tatka questioned the cleanup of the Zinc Mine site and asked if the DEP was involved with the cleanup.

Mr. John Christiano stepped forward. Mr. Christiano, Chairman of the Planning Board, commented that the redevelopment category that this property falls under takes away a lot of the approval authority from the planning board. Mr. Christiano

asked Mr. Ursin for clarification on the tax abatement, whether it's a pilot program or something else. The taxes that do come into the municipality go to the municipality, they do not go to the county or the school.

Mr. Ursin commented that is something that would need to be negotiated.

Mr. Christiano presented old plans from the site and referred to old buildings to be preserved.

The Water Sewer fund balance increased from roughly \$2.6 million to \$2.665 million. Good to see good collection rates. Mr. Sarinelli went over the recommendations of the audit; segregation of

duties, internal controls, CFO turnover, water sewer fund reconciliation wasn't done in a timely manner. The water sewer fund reconciliations have already started to be addressed.
