Mayor Sowden called the meeting to order and requested the Borough Clerk to call the roll. Upon roll call, the following members of the Governing Body were present: Mrs. Carnes, Mrs. Heath, Mr. Limon, Mr. Skellenger, Mr. Snyder and Mayor Sowden.

Mayor Sowden led the assembly in the flag salute.

Mayor Sowden stated "This meeting is being held in compliance with the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et sequentes. It has been properly advertised by posting in Borough Hall and posted on the Borough website, which adequate notice has been certified by the Clerk."

PRESENTATIONS

There were no presentations for tonight's meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Limon commented that he talked to Concetto regarding the status of High Street.

Mr. Spidaletto commented that the hole was filled in with concrete two weeks ago, other fill was added last week and today it was paved. We just need the final review from our engineer on the roadway and if Council is in agreement to it and if the engineer saying that everything is OK that roadway can be opened up.

Mrs. Carnes commented that the rain did hold off for us yesterday and it was great to see people out and it was a beautiful ceremony that was done across from the Borough Hall.

Mr. Snyder had nothing to report.

Mrs. Heath commented that on May 17th, Judy Williams helped organize some games and exhibits for the Franklin Band Concert and Curt's Dog House served 100 hot dogs for everyone who attended the mini parade (compliments of the Borough). Mrs. Heath has reached out to recreation regarding a report from the Carnival. Upcoming events for Recreation: June 20th Sussex Minors Baseball Game, June 27th Franklinite and Day, Fireworks; Recreation is planning a lot of activities including Miss Franklin Pageant, September 5th Mets Games and September 26th Windcreek trip.

Mr. Skellenger thanked the district 24 office for the help in obtaining the Motor Vehicle Mobile Unit. June 9th the Motor Vehicle Mobile unit will be at Franklin Pond, all real id appointments are taken but there are still appointments available for other services.

Mrs. Little had nothing to report.

Mr. Spidaletto commented that the rails to trails grant application has been submitted, he and Mrs. Heath and Mr. Skellenger attended the business-to-business lunch today at Servant's Heart Ministry. Servants Heart is a local trade school.

Mr. Windels had nothing to report.

Mayor Sowden thanked the American Legion for the parade. About a month ago we talked about flags and banners for the 250th Anniversary and Mayor Sowden asked how the Council was feeling about that and asked if we wanted to move forward and put an order together. Mayor Sowden would like to get things rolling so that by the 4th of July we'll be displaying some really nice flags throughout the town. Mayor Sowden wanted to let everyone know that he had a little chat yesterday about Michael Rorick and his wife and how they were some of the founding families that

founded Franklin. The Historical Commission and Society are going to do, with the County, a small ceremony and monument at the gravesite.

Mrs. Williams commented that yes, we have the revolutionary war marker, we have the marker from DAR and we just need to form a committee to discuss how and when the ceremony will be done.

Ms. Patty Trojanowski stepped forward. Ms. Trojanowski found a flag on the ground on Main Street. Ms. Trojanowski commented that she noticed that the roof on the church has a hole in it.

Ms. Joanne Tatka stepped forward. Ms. Tatka asked what flags were being talked about, regular American flags.

Mayor Sowden commented American Flags with the 250th Anniversary on them.

Ms. Tatka commented she thought it was brought up at one meeting about doing the flags for honoring heroes.

Mayor Sowden commented that we will be doing those but not until later on next year.

Ms. Tatka asked if the Catholic Church owned any land regarding rails to trails.

Mayor Sowden commented that the Church does not own land as it was sold to the State of New Jersey.

Ms. Tatka asked if Franklin House was back on the tax rolls.

Mayor Sowden commented that we are still looking into it.

Ms. Tatka commented that something was brought up about data centers at the last meeting and there was an article in the Herald and the Herald was listing it by Counties and for Sussex County it listed one in Franklin. Which used to be the satellite place behind Walmart, is that a data center. Do people work there yet and do they use a lot of water.

Mayor Sowden commented that as far as we know it is, to our knowledge people still work there and there is not a lot of water use.

Mrs. Carnes commented that the one that had been there behind the Walmart for a number of years, it's an older data center so it does not use as much electricity or water but the ones now they are proposing to build are more the AI technology that is coming that is requiring a lot more.

Ms. Tatka asked if anything was found out about the Metal Tec property.

Mr. Spidaletto commented that it was investigated by the County Board of Health and they did a thorough job. They spoke with the owners of the company and there was light disturbance there. Hardyston also came out and checked that location. The County Board of Health provided us with a report that did not find any violations at all. They were trying to expand their back driveway a little bit to accommodate vehicles.

Ms. Tatka questioned the payment plan for the laundry mat.

Mayor Sowden commented that they became in arrears while doing construction and what has to happen is they have to be made hole by the time they start to do business so we wanted to be business friendly and we worked out a payment plan.

Ms. Colleen Crouch stepped forward. Ms. Crouch asked what the job is or why we have a zoning office and staff. Ms. Crouch has been reporting about her neighbor and a wood pile being on the property line. The first time that she has emails going back and forth with Michelle about the wood pile is September 2025. The wood pile is still there. Ms. Crouch commented that they cannot sit in their backyard because it is full of mice and it stinks. Ms. Crouch has an email from Michelle saying that the property owner has been summoned but the legal system is broken and there are no consequences for not appearing in court over a zoning summons. So why do we need a zoning office?

Mayor Sowden commented that we have to have a zoning office by law. Mayor Sowden commented that we will follow up on this.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PAYMENT PLAN FOR DELINQUENT WATER AND SEWER FEES

WHEREAS, Franklin Boro Apartments LLC (the “Owner”) is the owner of real property in the Borough of Franklin (the “Borough”) located at 104 Main Street, Franklin, New Jersey, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey and more particularly described on the Borough’s Tax Maps as Block 1004, Lot 2 (the “Property”); and

WHEREAS, the Owner has completed construction to utilize the Property as a laundromat, however, the Owner was denied a certificate of occupancy by the Borough due to unpaid water and sewer utility fees in the amount of \$21,054.49; and

WHEREAS, the Owner has asked the Borough to consider authorizing a payment plan to address the delinquent water and sewer fees which will allow the Owner to receive the certificate of occupancy needed to open the laundromat to the public as well as generate the funds required to pay the delinquent water and sewer fees; and

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to maintain its reputation as a strong business-friendly community and permit the Owner to enter into a payment plan to address the delinquent water and sewer fees subject to certain penalties in the event the Owner defaults on the terms of the payment plan; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and the Owner have negotiated a payment plan whereby the Owner will make twenty-four (24) monthly payments to the Borough in the amount of \$877.27, which is the current outstanding balance of water and sewer fees attached to the Property divided into twenty-four (24) equal installments; and

WHEREAS, the Owner wishes to be bound by the negotiated terms of the payment plan, which are more fully described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Franklin, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, does hereby approve a payment plan with the Owner for the unpaid water and sewer utility fees, with the terms defined as follows:

1. The term of the payment plan shall be twenty-four (24) months. On the first (1st) day of each month, beginning July 1, 2026 and ending July 3, 2028, the Owner shall pay to the Borough the sum of \$877.27, which may include any accrued penalties such as late fees or interest, and shall be applied by the Borough against the outstanding water and sewer utility fee balance of \$21,054.49 as of June 9, 2026.
2. In the event the Owner fails to make a required monthly payment, the Borough shall have the right to place a lien on the Property for the full amount of the outstanding sewer and water utility fee balance as of the date of the first missed payment.
3. The Owner must also make all required payments to keep the water and sewer accounts current from this point forward. Failure to keep the water and sewer accounts current, will result in a material breach of this payment plan, and entitle the Borough to file a

lien against the Owner's property for the full amount of the outstanding sewer and water utility fee balance.

4. The payment plan shall be effectuated upon the signature of the Mayor and an authorized representative of the Owner, below.
5. Upon execution of this payment plan, the Borough shall issue a certificate of occupancy to the Owner for the Property so the Owner may begin operating the laundromat.
6. The Borough Administrator and Borough Tax Collector are hereby authorized to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING GOVERNOR MIKIE SHERRILL RESTORE FULL FUNDING TO THE NEW JERSEY SCHOOL OF CONSERVATION

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2022, the State of New Jersey Legislature amended N.J.S.A. 18A:64I-1, et seq. transferring the direction of the New Jersey School of Conservation ("NJSOC") property from Montclair State University to the Friends of the New Jersey School of Conservation, a tax-exempt nonprofit organization; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64I-1, NJSOC shall be used in perpetuity as a school for environmental field study under the direction of the Friends of the NJSOC pursuant to a 20-year lease between the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and Friends of NJSOC; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 18A:64I-5 provides that the State of New Jersey shall provide all moneys appropriated by an annual appropriations act for the maintenance and support of the NJSOC to the Friends of NJSOC, which shall expend the funds for the expenses necessary for the operation of the NJSOC, including maintenance of the grounds and buildings, purchase of equipment, funding educational programs, and housing students and teachers; and

WHEREAS, any monies appropriated under N.J.S.A. 18A:64I-5 shall pass through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to the Friends of NJSOC; and

WHERE AS, the State of New Jersey has eliminated funds for the operation and maintenance of the NJSOC thus forcing the NJSOC to close: and

WHERE AS, such a closing will hurt the local Sussex County economy, where the NJSOC has worked with 9 local businesses contributing \$1.7 million to the local economy over the past three years; and

WHERE AS, partnerships, associations and programs with numerous local community organizations including Sussex County ARC, Sussex County Library, Sussex County Self Sufficiency - NJ Youth Corps, Sussex County Chamber of Commerce will be curtailed; and

WHERE AS, eight Sussex County elementary schools who rely on their environmental education programming through field trips at the NJSOC will be halted; and

WHERE AS, a dozen Sussex County teachers who have attended teacher professional development training on conservation, stewardship and climate change will no longer have the benefit of this necessary training; and

WHERE AS, the Sussex County Community College has recently entered into a partnership to allow for field study, research and interns at the NJSOC for their students; and

WHERE AS, if not funded, the NJSOC would be forced to layoff of 30 dedicated professionals many who live in Sussex County,

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved, that the Governing Body of Franklin Borough in full consideration of the negative impact to the economy of Sussex County, the State of New Jersey, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the students, educators and researchers of the state of New Jersey, call upon Governor Mikie Sherrill to immediately restore the New Jersey School of Conservation's budget request of Three million (\$3,000,000.00) Dollars.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Municipal Clerk shall forward a certified true copy of this resolution to the Office of Governor Mikie Sherrill; Assemblywoman Dawn Fantasia, Assemblyman Michael Inganamort, the New Jersey School of Conservation and all Sussex County Municipalities.
